

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PREFACE

i

The fundamental insight—that Christian Science is a *Science*—brings with it crucial implications for how Christian Science can be most fruitfully approached. Whereas religion draws on sentiment, belief, and ritual observance, a science requires an ordered, systematic education with inquiry as its basis. Such a logical method of investigation opens the field for anyone who is willing to study the subject in a step-by-step manner, working from the simplicity of the fundamentals to the fullness of their implications.

This accent on an ordered schooling is fundamental to the Science of Christian Science. Why? The essence of Science lies in its ability to reduce an infinite unknown —namely, God as a whole—to the simplicity of a few fundamental categories. What are these categories?

- 1) The 7 synonymous terms for God—Mind, Spirit, Soul, Principle, Life, Truth, Love—present the *nature* of Being.
- 2) The 4-fold calculus—Word, Christ, Christianity, Science—shows the *self-operation* of Being.
- 3) The 4 levels of Science—Science itself, divine Science, absolute Christian Science, Christian Science—show the *dimensions of spiritual consciousness* thorough which Being operates and presents itself in life-experience.

Through these few categories, the nature, operation and multidimensional workings of the one Being can be understood, revealing the divine system of Science. As Mrs. Eddy stated:

"Divine metaphysics is now reduced to a system, to a form comprehensible by and adapted to the thought of the age in which we live" (S&H 146:31). MH: Reduction to system.

What is the practical value of learning and understanding this system? The system of the fundamental categories of Being presents the basic tools of Christian Science, for all scientific work—be it study and research, text-interpretation, or demonstration and practice—builds on an understanding of these categories.

"This system enables the learner to demonstrate the divine Principle on which Jesus' healing was based" (S&H 147:1).

The system of Science provides the foundation for all understanding and demonstration, establishing in us a divine standpoint and consciousness.

To this end, study and research in the Science of Christian Science is devoted wholly to understanding the few fundamental categories, focusing on such questions as:

- How are the *capitalized terms* defined divinely (rather than in a humanly subjective way)?
- What *scientific methods* enable us to discover their divine definition?
- How do the capitalized terms *blend and interrelate* with each other, not only to correct counterfeit concepts, but also to *form a spiritual structure*?

- How do these spiritual structures manifest themselves through *symbols*, e.g., through the text of the Textbook (*Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures* by Mary Baker Eddy) or through the more abstract symbol of the Model of Being (The Chart)?
- How do the spiritual structures enable us to discern the *spiritual laws* of Being?

The information and diagrams in this *Study Aid* have evolved over years in the ongoing endeavor to answer these questions through Science and a spiritually scientific understanding of the Bible and the Christian Science textbook. Experience has shown that visual aids, especially in the form of charts or diagrams, are highly supportive of a more structured understanding of the subject. Unlike prose, charts and diagrams are uniquely adapted presenting—with maximum simplicity—a whole structure of relationships. They thereby convey the core of the subject, providing a basis for much elaboration and individual inspiration. For this reason, I have brought together, in this book, those few diagrams which are most adapted to explaining the system of Christian Science—though this collection is by no means exhaustive.

On each page of this Study Aid are references showing where, in the many books and recordings, the subject is explained in depth. In this way, the study aid can be of great assistance to individual home-study. One finds a line of ordered investigation of the subject through which each student can progress self-reliantly in the study of the system of Christian Science.

Because this *Study Aid* mainly contains diagrams and not the explanation that goes along with them, it should only be used in conjunction with my books and summer school recordings. It is not intended to stand as a self-contained presentation of the subject.





A process of reasoning by the use of symbols (Webster).

Calculus of operations: A systematic method of treating problems by operating upon (seeing the relationship among) symbols of operation (Webster).

category

One of the underlying forms to which any fact known by experience must conform; specifically defined divisions in a system of classification (Webster).

A class, division, genus, family, or type with which distinctions are made among things for conceptual analysis and classification (Peter A. Angeles: Dictionary of Philosophy).

Any basic idea, concept, notion, or principle fundamental to a system of philosophy; an ultimate conceptional form by which knowledge is made possible, providing the foundation for all meaning (*ibid*.)

A system of categories is constituted of the pure concepts or principles that provide the necessary structure for understanding. Nothing is intelligible unless put into the framework of these categories. Our understanding of things is formed by the categories. And things themselves are formed by the forces acting in nature which operate according to these categories (*ibid*.).

classification

Systematic arrangement in groups or categories according to established criteria (Webster).

dimensionalism

The concept that one identity, when translated to different levels or standpoints of consciousness, can appear in different forms, while at the same time preserving its one, original identity (see *A Study Aid for the Science of Christian Science*, page 104).

gestalt

A unified physical, psychological, or symbolic configuration having properties that cannot be derived from its parts (American Heritage Dictionary).

The basic idea is that the parts of a shape only have meaning by the fact that they belong to a whole, i.e., a shape cannot be split up into its elements without losing the meaning which it possess as a whole. A form is more than the sum-total of its elements (Francois, Charles (editor), *International Encyclopedia of Cybernetics and Systems*, KG. Saur, Munich, Germany, 1997).

order

paradigm

A world view or model of understanding and consciousness.

A universally recognized scientific achievement that for a time provides model problems and solutions to a community of practitioners (Thomas Kuhn, *The Structure of Scientific Revolution*).

Some accepted examples of actual scientific practice — examples which include law, theory, application, and instrumentation together — which provide models from which spring particularly coherent traditions of scientific research (*ibid.*).

science

Knowledge of a single fact, not known as related to any other, or of many facts not known as having any mutual relations or as comprehended under any general law, does not reach the meaning of science: science is knowledge reduced to law and embodied in a system (Funk & Wagnalls Dictionary).

A branch of study which is concerned either with a connected body of demonstrated truths or with observed facts systematically classified and more or less colligated by being brought under general laws, and which includes trustworthy methods for the discovery of new truths within its own domain (Oxford Dictionary).

"Divinely defined, Science is the atmosphere of God; humanly construed, and according to Webster, it is 'knowledge, duly arranged and referred to general truths and principles on which it is founded, and from which it is derived.' I employ this awe-filled word in both a divine and human sense" (No. 9:25).

structure

Root: *structura* (Latin) = to arrange, to fit together, ordering.

The interrelationships of parts as dominated by the general character of the whole (Webster).

Structures appear wherever elements combine into a meaningful whole whose arrangements follow definite laws (Webster).

A structure is the sum-total of relationships which maintains the communication among the various parts of a whole (Amar).

structuralism

- A method of procedure which transforms every problem into a structural problem (Amar).
- In structuralism, an object itself and its various constituents are seen as points of intersection of multitudinous systems of reference (*ibid*.).
- Structuralism is a mode of thought; structuralism constitutes essentially a method. By method [is meant] any set of rules or regulations which describes and prescribes the operations to be performed upon any matter with the purpose of ordering it and understanding its workings (Michael Lane, *Introduction to Structuralism*).
- A structure is a system of transformations. Inasmuch as it is a system and not a mere collection of elements and their properties, these transformations involve laws: the structure is preserved for enriched by the interplay of its transformation laws, which never yield results external to the system nor employ elements that are external to it. In short, the notion of structure is comprised of three key ideas: the idea of wholeness, the idea of transformation, and the idea of self-regulation (Jean Piaget, *Structuralism*).

synergy

The additional benefit accruing to a number of systems should they coalesce to form a larger system; the concept reflects the classical idea that the whole is greater than the sum of its parts. Synergy is formally studied as property of systems by cybernetics (Harper Dictionary of Modern Thought).

synonymous

By synonymous words we usually understand words that coincide or nearly coincide in some part of their meaning, and may, hence, within certain limits be used interchangeably, while outside of these limits they may differ very greatly in meaning and use. It is the office of a work on synonyms to point out these correspondences and differences, that language may have the flexibility that comes from freedom of selection within the common limits, with the perspicuity and precision that result from exact choice of the fittest word to express each shade of meaning outside of the common limits. To consider synonymous words identical is fatal to accuracy; to forget that they are similar, to some extent equivalent and sometimes interchangeable, is destructive of freedom and variety (Funk & Wagnalls).

Thus, synonymous terms: (a) coincide in some part of their meaning and are in this context — in this certain limit — freely interchangeable; yet also (b) have clearly distinguishable differences and are, therefore, not freely interchangeable outside of context (a).

vs. equinyms: Words identical or completely equivalent in meaning (many linguists maintain that no such words exist, for, in the economy of language, why would there be two rather than one word, if indeed there were no perceivable difference?).

system

A regularly interacting or interdependent group of items forming a unified whole (Webster).

An assemblage of things unified into a consistent whole by a regular inter-relationship (interaction, interdependence, interconnection) of its parts (Angeles, Peter A., *Dictionary of Philosophy*, Harper Collins, NY, 1981).

An assemblage of things working in a coherent order according to some rational or intelligible principle, plan or method (*ibid*.).



The Divine System of Reference

THE DIVINE SYSTEM OF REFERENCE



Science: The key of Science lies in its ability to reduce the infinite One to simplicity:

- a) to a few, simple, fundamental yet comprehensive categories
- b) that interrelate and operate with each other on one Principle to form dynamic and coherent structures
- c) that underlie all being and solve all questions of existence.

Through the tool of Science, we are able to understand God in its system and structure. Science evolves in us a divinely structured consciousness, until the structure of our consciousness reflects and is one with the structure of Being.

A NOTE ON COLOR CODING: Many students find it helpful to color-code the tones of the synonyms in their notes. There is no significance to the colors we have selected for each synonym above (the spectrum in a rainbow). Feel free to use this color scheme, or any other color scheme you wish, if you feel it will aid you in your study. The selection of color for category II and III (the 4-fold operation and 4 levels) do have significance, however, as they reflect the tones of the synonyms from which they are derived (Principle, Life, Truth, Love).

The Nature of Being

"Question.—What is God?

"Answer.—God is incorporeal, divine, supreme, infinite Mind, Spirit, Soul, Principle, Life, Truth, Love.

"Question.—Are these terms synonymous?

"Answer.—They are. They refer to one absolute God. They are also intended to express the nature, essence, and wholeness of Deity" (S&H 465: 8–14).

In our study of Science, it is most fruitful to begin with the divinely inspired definition of God as *Mind, Spirit, Soul, Principle, Life, Truth, Love*. To understand the importance and place value of these synonyms each synonym must be clearly differentiated from the others. This means that each one of the 7 synonyms for God must be defined through its individual characteristic nature—through its characteristic *ideas*. So each synonym for God can be defined through the ideas that *characterize* it specifically and *differentiate* it from the other synonyms.

Once we undertake a study of the individual nature of each synonym, we discover that the synonyms for God occur in a specific contexts that are not freely interchangeable. Unfortunately, the belief still persists that because each of the synonyms stands for God, they must be freely interchangeable. But if this were so, we could ask: Why have seven terms, if one would do? Why complicate things, if it can all be so simple? The short answer is: Most students of Christian Science are not familiar with the meaning of the term "synonym," or with the synonymy-principle that underlies the language of the Christian Science textbook. In order to understand Christian Science in its *Science*, one must undertake a thorough examination of the 7 synonyms for God. The diagrams and tables in this section, Category I, will show the importance of the 7 synonymous terms for God in understanding Science, the Bible, and the nature of Being itself.

¹ It was on this fundamental question of the spiritually scientific meaning of the 7 synonymous terms for God that John Doorly was excommunicated from the Christian Science Church organization in 1946. 

RULES FOR STUDYING THE 7 SYNONYMOUS TERMS FOR GOD

1. The answer to the question: "How is the synonym characterized in this sentence?" must always name a characteristic of the synonym. It must convey something about the nature of the synonym itself and *not*, for example, man's attitude towards a synonym.

For example, S&H 143:26: "Mind is the grand creator..." Here Mind is characterized as the creator.

Be sure to make a list of your findings.

- 2. As much as possible, try to answer with the letter of the text. Do not get sidetracked on developing long metaphysical arguments or expositions that are not in the simplicity of the reference itself.
- 3. Do not give your humanly subjective interpretation—"What the text says to me," or "how the text inspires me." The issue is: "What is the text telling us about the synonym?"—not our personal views.
- 4. Not every sentence with a synonym in it defines the synonym's meaning.

For example, S&H 256:18: "...What is infinite Mind or divine Love?" This reference indicates no specific characteristic of either synonym.

5. Grammatically, a double negative statement can be put into the positive.

For example, S&H 1:10: "Thoughts unspoken are not unknown to the divine Mind." In other words: Mind knows (all).

- 6. When you first begin this work, list only the very clear, conclusive findings; do not list those findings which are questionable.
- 7. Be careful in listing natural or biblical symbols such as "light," "sword," "warfare," etc. Fundamentally, we should only list abstract terms which most clearly state the nature of the synonym.
- 8. Make a special list for the root counterfeits of every synonym.
- 9. Also, for now, omit combinations of two or more synonyms.

For example: Principle, Love; or Life, Truth, Love, etc.

- 10. Caution: Synonyms are often used in combination with ideas characterizing other synonyms to offset a counterfeit belief. In such cases, the ideas used are not intrinsically characteristic of the synonym with which they appear. For a discussion of this special use of synonyms, see Max Kappeler, *Complete Compendium for the Study of Christian Science*, Appendix 3 "The Study of Synonyms," p. 258.
- 11. In blendings, the theme stated in a sentence determines which synonym must be used. We must ask: What is the theme presented in the text to be dealt with through the use of the synonym?
- 12. Because the synonyms all refer to God, there are ideas which are characteristic of all synonyms. Having a common referent—God—the synonyms have certain common characteristics among them. These shared characteristics should not be listed as uniquely characterizing any one synonym.

For example: "divine" and "infinite" apply to all synonyms.

13. Continue your research over time. When this study is first undertaken, the findings will be only an approximation. Each succeeding research effort will weed out inaccuracies, clarifying and refining our understanding of the meaning of each synonym as it is characterized in the Textbook.



The Stages of Culturing Spiritual Consciousness

1. Concept-building:

Getting the concepts clear:

- a) in what they mean through text-analysis.
- b) as defined through their relationships.

What we do: Think through the concepts to establish the perfect concept, or "idea."

2. Tonality-building:

Seeing all the ideas of a synonym tightly interwoven so as to form one overall tone of a synonym, including all ideas.

What we do: Ponder the ideas together to establish the tone of the synonym itself, embracing all ideas.

3. Consciousness-building:

"Thinking about" the synonym melts into a pure consciousness of the synonyms — "thinking from" the synonyms in divinely differentiated consciousness; the divinely objective becomes humanly subjective.

What we do: Mother the synonyms in consciousness.

4. Being-building:

Consciousness determines being; the consciousness of the 7 synonyms for God becomes our only being.





The fourfold operational sense of Being: Word, Christ, Christianity, Science

The Word-order

When John Doorly undertook his meticulous research of the synonyms for God in 1938/39, he followed the sequence of *Mind, Spirit, Soul, Principle, Life, Truth, Love* as given on page 465 of the Textbook, *Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures*, by Mary Baker Eddy. These seven synonyms define the nature, essence and wholeness of God. In the course of further study it was seen that this order of the seven synonyms for God is not a casual one, that they are not arranged in an arbitrary way. Quite the reverse. It is the only order possible if the *Word* of God or the Logos is to be defined. There are 5,040 possibilities of arranging all the seven synonyms in sequence, but Mary Baker Eddy could put them in only one order when the purpose of the order is to bring out the aspect of the *creative* Word of God. This Word-order shows the spiritual flow from the creative Mind up to its fulfillment in Love, thus symbolizing also the unchanging order of the seven days of creation.

The Christ-order

Though the discovery of the meaning of the Word-order and its far-reaching implications for any creative activity was overwhelming, an honest investigation of the synonyms for God could not overlook the fact that there are other orders of the seven synonyms in the Textbook. For instance, in "scientific translation of immortal Mind" on page 115 of "Science and Health" we find the order of divine Principle, Life, Truth, Love, Soul, Spirit, Mind defining the Christ in its office of translating God to the point of idea. As this order illustrates a different purpose from that of the Word, the synonyms for God are arranged in a different order. Again we become aware that in a structural concept it is not the facts (The synonyms per se) which are super-important but rather the relationships, the order, which exists between the facts. The office of the Christ is to translate God, the divine Principle which is Life, Truth, and Love, through Soul and Spirit to the point of manifesting God as perfect idea in Mind. Whenever the argument comes up in our consciousness that God does not come to a specific situation, we can counteract this argument of the anti-Christ by the understanding that the self-operative Principle which is the all-impelling Life, the evereffective Truth and the ever-saving Love exchanges through Soul the false testimony of the material senses, thereby cleansing every situation through the onliness and purity of Spirit, so that only that which is of the nature of idea is manifested as the presence of the All-Mind. You can just feel the terrific power of this translation-order, sweeping away all that would obstruct the divine manifestation.

The Christianity-order

Again, on page 587 of "Science and Health" the term God is described in a different order, to bring out the Christianity sense. Here the order is Principle; Mind; Soul; Spirit; Life; Truth;

Love, depicting Principle, God's reflection as Principle's universe. The focus is on idea and this order answers the question: How big is a spiritual idea? It is always an idea of Principle in the universe of Mind, fully identified with this Principle through Soul-sense, thereby reflecting in Spirit all other idea, thus being father (Life), son (Truth), and mother (Love) to the whole universe. Here the order serves to establish the full-reflection of God's ideas.

The Science-order

These three orders are the only ones in which all the seven synonymous terms appear together in the Textbook. John Doorly naturally felt that there should be a fourth, for *Science*, because the holy city has four sides, which Mrs. Eddy interpreted as Word, Christ, Christianity, and Science. Praying about it, he could see that Being is not linear, but structural, so that the Word-order, when seen structurally, is founded on Principle, the middle term of the seven synonyms. Principle is based on the divine nature of Mind, Spirit, Soul, and demonstrated in its essence as Life, Truth, and Love. This reminded him of the symbol of the seven-branched candlestick. The seven lamps are not connected with one another in a linear sequential way but related through structure. This is very typical of Science: linear sequence, when understood in its isness becomes structural being.

Therefore, if you look at the Word-order of Mind, Spirit, Soul, Principle, Life, Truth, Love, not as linear arrangement but from the center, the shaft (Principle), you get a structural understanding of the synonyms for God. Next to *Principle*, are *Soul and Life*, then *Spirit and Truth*, and finally *Mind and Love*, connected in pairs, all resting on the central shaft of *Principle*.


The Development from Word to Science



Word (line)




Christ (plane)





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







THE 4 LEVELS OF SCIENCE:

The dimensional aspect of Being is the four levels of Science itself, divine Science, absolute Christian Science, and Christian Science. This development of defining the seven synonymous terms for God and the four sides of the holy city as Word, Christ, Christianity, and Science has brought us up to the time of World War II. Though it seemed that much had been achieved, there was still something missing. Quite a few paradoxical questions remained unsolved, and a fundamental key was needed to solve them. They were the paradoxes that every sincere thinker encounters when studying the Textbook. To take two simple examples:

- Christian Science teaches on the one hand that God knows no sickness and on the other hand that God heals sickness;
- that there is no evil and yet that we have to overcome evil.

For those thinking along the lines of classical logic, such seeming paradoxes or contradictions are encountered again and again in the Textbook. But in fact Mrs. Eddy does not contradict herself, if the Textbook is read with the transclassical logic which she was already using a century before the other sciences and the world awoke to it. As she wrote the Textbook in a structural way and not according to one-dimensional linear reasoning, her teaching can only be understood through a multi-dimensional logic.

John Doorly realized that the subject of the Textbook has various levels of spiritual altitudes and that this is brought out by the various levels of Science. He showed that any subject has a different aspect according to whether it is treated from the point of view of *Science itself*, from *divine Science*, from *absolute Christian Science* or from *Christian Science*. Therefore the student must approach the Christian Science textbook with a consciousness that is cultured in thinking dimensionally with a dimensional logic, and then the seeming paradoxes can be solved even rationally.²





The Dimensional Structuring of the Ideas of the Seven Synonyms for God

On the basis of the levels of Science, the ideas of the seven synonyms for God can be dimensionally ordered, showing how the synonyms themselves appear on each level. Considering the levels in the descending way, we can distinguish definite categories:

Science itself:

I. What is the synonym as itself? i.e., What does the synonym know about itself as itself, as the synonym as such, or as a whole?

divine Science

II. What is the synonym in its own realm? Here the focus is on those ideas that express the universal realm of the synonym, its whole sphere of self-expression, all that the synonym includes within its own domain.

absolute Christian Science

III. What is the synonym in relation to its creation? The focus is no longer on the universal oneness of Principle and idea, but on the ideas themselves and how ideas express the infinite relationships within Being.

Christian Science

- IV. In what form does the synonym come to the human? When the divine touches the human, it translates itself in such a way that it is reflected in the human, showing the coincidence of the divine and the human.
- V. What does the synonym do in the realm of its suppositional opposite? When the divine has an impact on the human (IV), whatever is unlike God must simultaneously yield. The healing, redeeming process takes place, as something is corrected in the human.
- VI. What higher attitude does the synonym bring forth in the human? When that which is unlike God in us gradually yields to the divine (V), something better and higher is brought about in the human; we manifest a higher humanhood through an attitude and consciousness that reflects the divine.
- VII. How does the synonym appear when it is not understood? When the entire process of translation (I-VI) is resisted through a lack of understanding, the synonym appears to us in the form of its suppositional opposite. The counterfeit-concept is therefore always the synonym itself, but in misunderstood form.

PART III

The Laws of Being

WHAT ARE THE DIVINE LAWS?3

Now, we want to proceed and touch on the great question of law.

We have seen that structure demands structural laws. Therefore, we should ask ourselves, what are the divine laws? Mrs. Eddy uses the term law in the Textbook and in her writings quite often. There is great emphasis on the fact that there are laws. But when you go through all the references and ask yourself what these laws are, you may have difficulty in finding out what these laws are.

Usually it is just stated that there are laws, that there are laws of God, but what they are, Mrs. Eddy does not state so explicitly. We are a bit at sea until we begin to investigate the Textbook in a structured way. Then the laws just jump out of the Textbook, one by one. If a textbook of mathematics says that mathematics has laws and that these laws are eternal, and these laws are good, would we know the laws? Could we calculate? We could not. We would have to know exactly what the elements are of such laws. You would have to be able to define what the elements are, and what the relationships are within a definite law. Only then can we have a clear concept of a law.

This is very difficult to see in the first investigation of the Textbook. Since my university years, I was constantly asking myself, what are those laws of which Mrs. Eddy speaks in the Textbook? One cannot just say there are laws and the laws of God but, nobody knows what the laws of God are. With some few exceptions, Mr. Doorly also did not teach about laws. Actually this question did not arise during his time, and I was very close to Mr. Doorly, especially in the years that were important for the whole development of the idea.

So we can see that, compared to that period of time, even to ask the question about laws was a new paradigm too. It is a question that has always been swept under the carpet. At that time no one was asking: What are the laws? What are these laws of God? Tell me how they are stated. Tell me the elements of each law. Tell me how these laws vary from each other. What is the difference between these laws? These questions were never asked. We have seen that a new paradigm asks new questions. It does not answer the old questions. It asks new questions and, therefore, also has to answer new questions.

For about twenty-five years, I was asking these new questions but did not get a single answer! I did not find any answers until about 1960 when I began to study the Minor Prophets. When I was asking a question about what I felt was an anomaly, I did not sweep it under the carpet. Then I felt it was something that would be very important. From that time on the question of law, and the answers of what laws are, came into focus.

Perhaps you know if you have read my book on the prophetic era, *The Minor Prophets in the Light of Christian Science*, ⁴ that I stated every prophet in the form of a law. There I stated the laws in their very clear-cut elements.

That was such a terrific change that nobody understood my book. They read it in the old paradigm of Bible interpretation. Because Mr. Doorly had interpreted the Bible over a period of

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years, and published about six thousand pages on Bible interpretation, that left only very little to his students for interpretation. So when I picked up the little remnants that were left from the Old Testament in a few of the Minor Prophets, they all thought that I was now interpreting the rest that was left over from John Doorly. But I did something completely different.

All those who bought my book just felt that it was nice but, it was the old story of interpreting biblical symbolism as metaphysical symbolism.

That was not the purpose of my book. I was thrilled to discover laws for the first time, and to learn how to formulate laws, and how to state laws within a bigger framework of the Christ matrix. That was the beginning of investigating the question of laws more and more.

We must be aware that this is a new paradigm, that it is asking new questions, and that it is answering new questions. But it also demands a completely different approach to the subject.

Laws of Isness (Being) Laws of Process

There are two big categories of laws which we call the laws of "isness," or of Being, and the laws of processes. You can state a law about something that *is*, but you also can have laws about something that has a process. These are two big categories.

In Black's "Law Dictionary," you will find this definition: "Law is that which is laid down, ordained, or established. A rule or method according to which phenomena or actions coexist." These would be the "isness" laws. They coexist or follow each other. These would be the laws of process. This is a law that shows how something follows something else, and so on. Whereas the laws of isness just show how phenomena coexist together.

We will examine both categories of laws when we go through the Chart. There we will find laws of isness and we will find laws of process. Webster says that "law is a statement of an order or relation of phenomena ... that, so far as it is known is invariable under the given conditions."

When we go through those laws, we will have to state the laws in their elements and see that, if we want to apply these laws, we have to adhere to them invariably. We should not try to constantly change them as we are used to doing in religious thinking. They are invariable under the given conditions. For instance, if we are thinking on the level of divine Science, then that is the given condition. We have within that condition, invariable laws. We can find invariable laws for all levels of consciousness.

The Random House "Dictionary of the English Language," gives another definition, which I feel is one of the best for us. It reads, "The law is a rule, principle or convention regarded as governing the structure or the relationship of an element in the structure of something." We can see that the law is that which governs the structure. It is a structural law. It is a law that governs the relationship of one element within that whole structure.

Laws: according to Mrs. Eddy⁵

It is interesting to go through the "Concordance" and look up all the statements Mrs. Eddy makes in "Science and Health," and in "Prose Works," on law, and laws. Here are a few quotes to show that she does not actually say very much about it.

If one regards law in relationship to God, which is one of the main characteristics of her writings—we see that she couples law with God—and has four different kinds of relationships, which would be in accordance with the Word, Christ, Christianity and Science.

She says, "God is the lawmaker" (381:151). That would be the Word. In the Christ, she says, God is the "Lawgiver" (Mis. 258:13). He gives the law. In Christianity, she says, "the Lawgiver was the only law of creation" (Mis. 259:14). That is Christianity, the universe, the law of creation. And in Science, she says, "God is ... the only law of being" (Mis. 17).

If you analyze these statements about God and law, you still do not know very much. You only know that God makes laws, and that God gives law, and that the creation of God has laws and that is the law of being. Yet you do not know the first thing about what these laws are. These quotes are not really revealing very much. She even makes that very important statement that God was "a law to Himself" (Mis. 258:13). Perhaps that statement can give us a clue of how to go about finding hidden laws embedded in "Science and Health."

Even when we ask what the connection is between law, the laws of God and Science—because we had a feeling that law had to do with Science—one does not really get a great measure of information. Mrs. Eddy just says, "Science is the law of God" (My. 347:24). So you get a little bit more information instead of just saying that God is the lawmaker and the lawgiver.

Mrs. Eddy says that the law of God is really Science, and that naturally builds a bridge, to the realization that the whole realm of Science is the law of God. But Science is a big field. It consists of system, categories, structures, and so on. But she also says that "Christian Science is the law of God…," It is not only Science. She continues, saying, "…interpreting and demonstrating the divine Principle and rule of universal harmony" (Rud. 1:2).

The moment Mrs. Eddy combines the law of God with Christian Science, then she means that these laws will be those laws that regulate the relationship of the divine Principle with the demonstration and interpretation of that Principle, bringing out the harmony of being.

The Science of the Bible

Equipped with a scientific, spiritual understanding of the divine system, John Doorly was able with its help to decode the Science of the Bible. Ever since the Bible has been in existence, hundreds of thousands, even millions of attempts have been made to interpret it. The interpretation changes according to the individual's subjective approach and inspiration. Are all free to interpret the Bible in any way they like, or is there *a fixed Principle* behind "the Scriptures, which grow in beauty and consistency from one grand root..." (S&H 341:6)? If there is, then this divine Principle interprets itself through and as the system of divine ideas which is inherent in the Principle itself. Knowing the system spiritually, John Doorly interpreted the Bible as a coherent exposition of the system of divine Principle.

We must therefore see the one super-important point, namely, that Doorly did not give just one more new interpretation of the Bible along side the already existing million ones; he did not give one more interpretation in the same category as all the others. Doorly's interpretation of the Bible is of an entirely new category—an interpretation from the standpoint of the one divine Principle interpreting itself through its own system. Mrs. Eddy supplied the key in the "Key to the Scriptures," namely in the chapters "Genesis" (with its main accent on the seven days of creation, indicating the seven synonyms for God) and "The Apocalypse" (with its main accent of the four sides of the holy city, the fourfold operational sense of Being.)

In investigating the Bible as a whole, Doorly first saw that the entire plan of the bible unfolded in thousand-year periods correlative to the order of the synonyms in the Word-order: Mind, Spirit, Soul, Principle, Life, leading in the sixth thousand-year period of Christian Science in Truth and to the coming millennium of Love. Also each book of the Bible shows a systematic layout. Some of the books unfold in the order of the seven synonyms as given in the Word-order, the Christ-order, the Christianity-order, or the Science-order; others may present their subject in the fourfold order of Word, Christ, Christianity, and Science, and so on. All this, therefore, shows that what Principle means to interpret is in the first place its own categories, its own structure, and not single incidents or aphorisms, not atomistic truths. This also naturally demands a completely new attitude on the student's part. It is not the interpretation of the parts which is of foremost interest, but the *structure* of the whole. The Principle of Christian Science is fundamentally holistic; the parts serve through their interrelations to bring out the whole.

The structure of the Christian Science Textbook

The second major result that followed from John Doorly's exposition of what constitutes the divine system of Christian Science concerns "Science and Health" as such. In the 1950's it was seen that the Textbook has a very balanced coherent structure, so that it can be understood as a most remarkable exposition of the idea of Christian Science, in which from sentence to sentence, from paragraph to paragraph, from chapter to chapter, there flows a consistent unfoldment of the structure of Christian Science.

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In reviewing the whole development since 1910, one cannot help feeling that Mrs. Eddy's prophecy has found its fulfillment:

"I foresee and foresay that every advancing epoch of Truth will be characterized by a more spiritual apprehension of the Scriptures, that will show their marked consonance with the textbook ... Interpreting the Word in the "new tongue," whereby the sick are healed, naturally evokes new paraphrase from the world of letters." (Mis. 363:30)⁸

Matrices

The Further Scientific Unfoldment to the Matrix Form

Contemplation of the fourfold order of Science led Doorly's understanding of the Science of Being further and further. The order of Science that includes the Science of Word, Christ, and Christianity is quite natural, because we know that in the one infinite Bing every identity of being reflects every other identity. Every side of the Holy City reflects every other side. This results in 4x4=16 aspects. How can each side be defined by the seven synonyms for God? The order of Science symbolized by the candlestick has already provided the answer for the Science side. But what is the arrangement for the orders of Word, Christ, and Christianity? The Word also reflects Word, Christ, Christianity, and Science. The Christ and Christianity also reflect the other sides in a fourfold manner. Thereby, we have a 4x4 description of the four orders of the synonyms. Each of the four orders reflects the fourfold calculus. This raises the question of the transitions within each order that represent the steps from Word to Christ, from Christ to Christianity, and from Christianity to Science. Expressed somewhat differently: What is the essence of Word, Christ, Christianity, and Science in each of the synonym-orders? Doorly spent three years studying this question (1943-1945). He had to rely entirely on his excellent spiritual scientific sense that had become sharpened through his successful spiritual practice.

The question he asked was the following: How do Word, Christ, Christianity, and Science reflect each other in the Word-order, in the Christ-order, in the Christianity-order, and in the Science-order? At first, Doorly had no texts that could have provided an answer. Therefore, he had to listen to the divine Being, that is, to the spiritual meaning of the four synonym-orders. He spent hours and hours in the attempt to sense spiritually the form that was crystallizing. The answer did not come immediately or at once, but gradually, through spiritually directed attempts, so he was always ready to change his findings. Through his letters and those of his assistant at the time, Peggy M. Brook, I was able to follow his spiritual wrestling in achieving the correct result. In his book, "The Pure Science of Christian Science" (first edition 1946), he published the results of his research. At his last summer school in Oxford (1949), he made the last change based on the Gospel of Mark (see the second edition of 1949).

He presented his results to his students in the form of a table or chart (see Table I, p. 15). A mathematician listening to one of his lectures informed him that in scientific circles this type of table was called a "matrix." From then on, his students incorrectly referred to it as the "Doorly-Matrix." This is a wrong designation, for the matrix does not deal with John Doorly, but rather with the immortal one Being. It is much more the "matrix of immortality" according to the Textbook (205:5).

How is the term "matrix" defined? The word is derived from Latin and means "womb" or "topsoil." Webster defines "matrix" as: "A place or enveloping element within which something originates, takes form, or develops." This rather biologically based definition is very informative for us. Our matrix is an enclosing element that is also unfolded by the all-embracing One until it

takes on its complete form. The mathematical definition then provides the rules about how a matrix is built up. It is determined by columns (verticals) and rows or lines (horizontals). Each of the columns has a common denominator. The same applies to the rows. Where the columns and rows meet, there are points of intersection, each of which yields a new value. They are called the matrix elements.⁹

How are the 4x4=16 points of intersection explained by John Doorly?

A matrix is a rectangular arrangement of elements.

An element is a primary component, in the sense that it is not possible to divide an element and at the same time retain the properties which are relevant to the associative context. Elements form the constituent parts of magnitudes; their interrelation constitutes the structure of a magnitude. Matrices afford a more accessible general view of the functional interconnections of elements within a system (*Lexikon der Planung und Oranisation*, 1968).

purpose:

The word 'matrix' (denotes) any ability, habit, or skill, any pattern of ordered behaviour governed by a 'code' of fixed rules (Koestler: The Act of Creation).
